



Carpenter Ant Removal Preparation Checklist

To ensure the effectiveness of the Carpenter ant treatment, the property must be fully prepared prior to service. Please follow the checklist below to complete all necessary preparations before the technician arrives.

- Before we begin the treatment, all occupants, including pets, must leave the unit and not re-enter for a minimum of 5 hours after our technician arrives.
 - Anyone who is pregnant, under 2 years old or has respiratory issues (like asthma) should leave the building for 24 hours.
 - Reduce clutter in the entire residents, especially in the infested areas.
 - If there are any large or heavy items in the infested areas, please remove them in order to give better access for our technician to do the treatment.
 - We may need access to the attic or basement areas where possible.
 - If possible, remove everything touching the external walls of the outside of the house.
 - There should be no firewood, lumber, old tree stumps, or any large items within 2 feet of the outside of the building.
 - All vegetation and tree branches should be 2 feet away from the walls.
 - Reduce clutter outside of the building, as Carpenter ants like to hide in rotting or damp wood.
 - Replace all rotting wood in the house, the back deck, or landscaping.
 - Remove and clean dead trees and leaves wherever possible.
1. Please do not wipe or mop the floors and baseboards for at least 7-14 days after treatment, as this will remove the residual product.
